

Diego Marconi (L. in Filosofia, Torino 1969; PhD, Philosophy, Pittsburgh 1979) is professor of Philosophy of Language in the School of Letters (*Facoltà di Lettere*) of the University of Torino. He previously taught Logic at the University of Cagliari (1990-91) and at the University of Eastern Piedmont at Vercelli (Philosophy of language, 1991-2004). He also gave logic and philosophy courses at Pittsburgh (1976, 1979), Geneva (2004) and Barcelona (2010). During his graduate studies he was a Harkness Fellow of the Commonwealth Fund (1974-76).

In Vercelli he was Chair of the Humanities Department (1997-2001), Chair of the philosophical curriculum (1992-95) and the communication science curriculum (2001-03), and Coordinator of the Doctoral Program in Philosophy of language (1994-2004). In Torino he has been Chair of the advanced curriculum in Philosophy and the History of Ideas (2007-09) and Deputy Director of the Doctoral School in Philosophy (2007-12).

He was President of the Italian Society for Analytic Philosophy (1996-98); he is a member of the Boards of the *Istituto superiore di scienze umane* of the Torino Polytechnical School, of the *Centro di studi semiotici e cognitivi* of San Marino University, of the *Istituto Banfi*. He was among the founders of the European Society of Analytic Philosophy (1990), being a member of the Society's first Steering Committee (1990-93). He was a member of the Philosophy panel of European Science Foundation (2005-06) working towards the European Index for the Humanities (ERIH). He is the coordinator of the subpanel of Philosophy, GEV 11 (ANVUR). He also was a Senior Fellow of the Center for Philosophy of Science at Pittsburgh (1983), NATO-CNR Fellow (1987), Chercheur Associé at CREA, Ecole Polytechnique of Paris (now the Centre Jean Nicod; 1996), Invited Research Scholar at the University of California at Irvine (2004), Visiting scholar at Oxford (2010) and Barcelona (2010).

He belongs to the Editorial Board of several journals, both Italian (*Sistemi Intelligenti*, *Iride*) and international (*Dialectica*, *Mind & Society*, *European Journal of Philosophy*, *European Journal for Philosophy of Science*, *Revue philosophique de Louvain*). He was or is a referee for those journals and many others, for the Universities of Padova and Venice, and for Oxford University Press. He was editor in chief of *Dizionario Palazzi-Folena della lingua italiana* (with Carla Marengo, 1986-92) and the 2nd edition of *Enciclopedia Garzanti di Filosofia* (with Maurizio Ferraris, 1993). His research interests mainly concern Wittgenstein's philosophy, analytic philosophy of language and the philosophy of cognitive science.
